**Equipment Capabilities:** De-escalation of conflicts and control of subjects using a compressed air launched projectile containing OC PAVA powder which can be deployed as a direct impact to the subject or for area saturation.

**Equipment Name:** Projectile Launch Platforms and their Associated Munitions, i.e; Less Lethal Shotgun Beanbag Munitions – CA Gov't Code 7070(c)(14)

**Lifespan:** Approximately 15 years

**Equipment Capabilities:** Remington 870 less lethal shotgun is used to deploy the less lethal Super-Sock Beanbag Round up to a distance of 75 feet. The range of the weapon system helps to maintain space between officers and a suspect reducing the immediacy of the threat which is a principle of De-escalation.

**Manufacturer Product Description:** "The Model 2581 Super-Sock delivers unprecedented accuracy and consistent terminal impact characteristics at close-in and extended ranges, thanks to the flexible tubular material bag specially developed for this unique less than lethal round. **Fiscal Impacts:** All Eureka Police Department less lethal bean bag shotguns were previously owned Remington 870 shotguns that have been converted to be used as a less lethal only platform. The conversion costs for the 15 less lethal shotguns was approximately \$1,020. The ongoing costs for ammunition will vary and maintenance is conducted by departmental staff.
