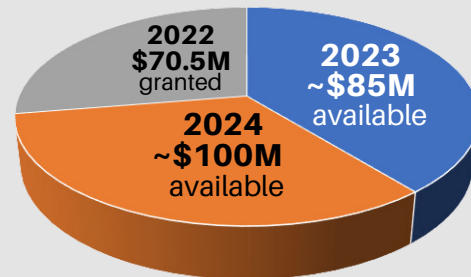
~ \$85 Million Available Now for Environmental Investigation and Cleanup in Disadvantaged California Communities

1. ECRG's MISSION & VISION

The ECRG is a historic investment in California's vulnerable and disadvantaged communities to address historic environmental injustices and set a path to improve public health and revitalize brownfields.

ECRG's mission is to EnCouRaGe beneficial reuse of land through assessment, investigation, and cleanup and to advance environmental justice goals through concerted support and deep investment in vulnerable and underserved communities.

ECRG's vision is to transform brownfields into vibrant community spaces where people live, work, play, and learn in harmony with their built environment.

2. ELIGIBILITY

Public entities, nonprofits, and tribes are eligible to apply to conduct environmental assessment, investigation and cleanup in California's most disadvantaged areas. 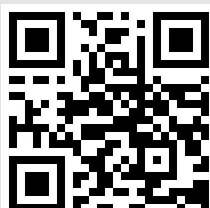
- \$350,000: Community-wide Assessment

- January 2024 - Decisions Released
- February 2024 - Agreements Executed
