DISCUSSION:

On January 10, 2012, the Board approved a reorganization of the Community Development Services Department that would create two new departments. On March 6, 2012, the Board appointed the Community Development Services Director, Mr. Kirk Girard, to head one of these two new departments, the Department of Economic Development and Natural Resources (EDNR). Mr. Girard's appointment to this position became effective this week. Last week, Mr. Girard provided notice of his intent to resign from the County, effective June 8.

At this time, the Board is faced with a decision whether to appoint a new Director of Economic Development and Natural Resources when Mr. Girard leaves County employment or to modify the previous reorganization plan. Your Board's Budget Subcommittee believes that the most fiscally prudent course is not to fill the department head position and merge the two divisions within EDNR into other existing County departments.

The Natural Resources Division of EDNR manages the County's involvement in the multi-jurisdictional Integrated Regional Water Management Plan as well as other natural resource fiscal components such as payments for Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grants under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. Currently, the Environmental Services Division of the Public Works Department manages the County's involvement in the multi-jurisdictional Klamath Basin agreements as well as other natural resource fiscal components such as grant administration for Park Bond Act funds. It makes functional as well as financial sense to merge these two Divisions under the leadership of the Deputy Public Works Director – Environmental Services.

The Economic Development Division of EDNR is a vital component of community outreach on the Board's Core Roles of encouraging new local enterprise and supporting business and workforce development, as well as the Strategic Priority of engaging in discussions of our regional economic future. These issues are so critical to the County's future revenue growth that the Budget Subcommittee believes they should be placed under the leadership of the County's budget staff in the County Administrative Office. The County Administrative Office currently includes six separate functions, but this Board has approved one of those functions – Risk Management – merging into a new Human Resources Department. The County Administrative Office should have the capacity with the loss of Risk Management to absorb supervision of Economic Development.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Not filling the Director position could save up to \$103,548 in salary for Fiscal Year 2012-13. This savings amount might be reduced if other positions are adjusted in recognition of new duties, but there should still be a net savings to the County.
