4. Describe how the scope of your proposal fits the intent of *Measure Z*. Specifically, how will it maintain and improve public safety and essential services, as described on the previous page?

The Humboldt Senior Resource Center's proposal to acquire emergency shelf-stable meals for all our participants directly addresses Measure Z's intent to maintain and improve public safety and essential services for Humboldt County residents. Our program specifically targets at-risk seniors and people with disabilities, a vulnerable population often disproportionately impacted by emergencies like power outages and severe weather. By ensuring our participants have access to food during these disruptions, we contribute to:

- Reduced strain on emergency services: If they have emergency food resources, seniors and people
 with disabilities can remain self-sufficient, minimizing reliance on emergency interventions. Many health
 conditions that affect the elderly and those with disabilities are caused by malnutrition. Ensuring food is
 available in an emergency helps avoid a health crisis that could put an older adult or a person with
 disabilities in the hospital at a time when those services need to be reserved for emergency response.
- Enhanced community resilience: If the Humboldt Senior Resource Center is already prepared to handle our participants' nutritional needs during an emergency, we can better support them in other ways, alleviating pressure on other community resources.

5. Please provide a brief description of the proposal for which you are seeking funding.

The Humboldt Senior Resource Center seeks \$36,300 to purchase 2,200 shelf-stable meal boxes, providing a 10-meal emergency food supply for the approximately 1,000 people enrolled in our programs, plus an additional 200 boxes to account for enrollment fluctuation or additional community needs. Providing shelf-stable meals for vulnerable seniors and people with disabilities to have on hand in the event of an emergency ensures their continued access to essential nutrition during power outages, extreme weather, road blockages, or other unforeseen disruptions.

We intend to provide shelf-stable meals for people enrolled in:

- Redwood Coast PACE (Program of All Inclusive Care for the Elderly), a wraparound health plan that serves people eligible for a nursing home level of care, with the goal of keeping them living independently at home.
- MSSP (Multipurpose Senior Services Program), a program with different services but the same goal, to help people who are at risk of placement in a skilled nursing facility remain at home.
- Adult Day Health Services, a day program for people ages 18+ with chronic conditions and disabilities.
- All our nutrition programs, including Meals on Wheels, three dining sites, and three mobile meal distribution sites.

Why is this critical? Senior citizens and people with disabilities face unique challenges:

• Increased vulnerabilities: Age and disability related health conditions and limited mobility make these groups more susceptible to the adverse effects of food insecurity during emergencies.

• Nutritional needs: Maintaining proper nutrition is crucial for managing chronic diseases, maintaining immune function, and preserving independence.

By providing shelf-stable meals, we are:

- Preventing malnutrition and its health consequences: Seniors and people with disabilities will have readily available nutritious food, reducing the risk of health complications due to missed meals, and therefore avoiding trips to the emergency room or other health providers.
- Promoting independence and dignity: The elderly and the disabled can remain self-sufficient during emergencies, avoiding reliance on others for basic needs.
- Mitigating stress and anxiety: Knowing they have food security provides peace of mind for our vulnerable participants during challenging situations.

6. How have you developed a plan for sustainability, including diversification of funding sources, for your proposal to carry on without reliance on future *Measure Z* funds? Please provide detail of your plan for sustainability here.

The Humboldt Senior Resource Center is committed to program sustainability. We will continue to actively seek funding from diverse sources like private foundations, individual donors, and other relevant grant funders to support the distribution of shelf-stable meals.

7. If this request is for the continuation or expansion of an existing program/service, what is the current source of funding for that program/service?

The Humboldt Senior Resource Center's nutrition programs are supported by a combination of federal and state government funding, state and local charitable foundations, and individual donors. These sources sustain our daily dining services and Meals on Wheels Redwood Coast, but do not leave remaining funds for the purchase of shelf-stable meals for the people we serve.

We began offering shelf-stable meals to participants in our nutrition program a few years ago thanks to pandemic-related federal funding available from the CARES Act and the American Rescue Plan Act. With this funding no longer available, we will continue to seek grant funding and reach out to individual donors to help pay for this extension of our nutrition programming.

8. If you are awarded *Measure Z* funds, how do you plan to leverage these funds to secure additional grants, contributions or community support?

Securing public funds signifies program value and enhances credibility for future grant applications. Measure Z funding will help us attract new and continued support from foundations and individual donors, helping to ensure continued operation of this and other programs at the Humboldt Senior Resource Center.

The award of Measure Z funds would be advertised to those receiving the shelf-stable meals and to the general public, helping people see the commitment both the County of Humboldt and the Humboldt Senior Resource Center have to supporting our most vulnerable community members.

Our current staff will distribute the shelf-stable meals to our participants so another entity will not be required.
