- 4. Describe how the scope of your proposal fits the intent of *Measure Z*. Specifically, how will it maintain and improve public safety and essential services, as described on the previous page?

Emergency services are essential to the residents in the goodwill response area, as well as for the vehicles traveling along the state highway through this area, which averages around 8,000 per day. The Board of Supervisors has stated that this service has been and is still essential. This goodwill response area is currently outside of any fire district boundaries, and even is outside of where CalFire normally responds. This area includes residents of Humboldt County, Federal and Private timberlands, and a major state highway that is the main artery for transporting commerce in and out of the county. Time is of the essence for fire, medical, and rescue services, and dependent on Willow Creek and Blue Lake volunteer firefighters to respond quickly. Being that this is a priority truck route in and out of Humboldt County, these joint fire/medical/rescue services are critical. This funding will assure ongoing collaborative emergency services in the goodwill response area by both Willow Creek and Blue Lake VFDs, coupled with ambulance service that is funded via Meas. Z. Both volunteer fire departments have committed to continue response in their area despite not receiving funds for FY 23/24, however may have to downgrade their response criteria because of the greater need within their funding district.

5. Please provide a brief description of the proposal for which you are seeking funding.

The Willow Creek and Blue Lake Fire Protection Districts are seeking funding to support their volunteer fire departments in responding to out of district calls in the 120 square mile goodwill response area that includes the S/R 299 corridor, Redwood Valley, Bair Rd., Titlow Hill, Lord Ellis, and 3 Creeks Rd., which has been funded by Measure Z since FY16/17. These out of district calls make up approximately one third of total annual call volume for both Blue Lake and Willow Creek, which is 60-90 calls per year. This strains our ability to maintain service in our own districts. Measure Z funding will help offset the cost associated with responding to out of district calls and ease the burden for the tax payers of Willow Creek and Blue Lake. This funding is necessary to continue to maintain emergency services that currently are being provided at no cost to the county, and are putting great strain on the volunteer fire departments. There is no fire district that includes this area within its boundaries, and annexation is not feasible for this large area. If funding is provided, it will ease some of the burden off of these two fire departments, and help maintain emergency services in this area.

Despite our great need for this funding, we feel strongly that if our application was approved, that the amount is not deducted from the amount awarded to the Fire Chief's Association because we do not want to take funding away from other volunteer fire departments. If that is the case, this application should be considered void.

6. How have you developed a plan for sustainability, including diversification of funding sources, for your proposal to carry on without reliance on future *Measure Z* funds? Please provide detail of your plan for sustainability here.

The essential services provided by Blue Lake and Willow Creek VFDs ensure the safety of Humboldt County residents, tourists, and commercial vehicles traveling along the state highway. Both departments agree that it is not entirely Humboldt County's responsibility to provide funding for emergency response in this area, and we

feel this is a critical responsibility of the California State Highway system. We have been in discussions with both Senator McGuire's office and the Rural County Representatives of California (RCRC) in concert with Supervisors Madrone and Wilson, CAO Hayes, and Deputy CAO Quincey in drafting potential legislation or a budget control proposal to allocate necessary funds to small rural fire departments so they can adequately respond to adjacent State Highways without adding burden to their low density communities financially. This is active for this state budget year. In addition to this undertaking, both fire agencies have and continue to apply for numerous grants at the local, state, and federal level to ease the financial burden.

7. If this request is for the continuation or expansion of an existing program/service, what is the current source of funding for that program/service?

Humboldt County has funded this collaborative service through the Fire Chief's Association until this fiscal year. We have agreed with Supervisors Madrone, Wilson, and CAO Hayes that we would continue response in the goodwill area this Fiscal Year, however as of now the cost associated is being funded directly by the two fire districts, which is a huge financial burden that is not sustainable.

8. If you are awarded *Measure Z* funds, how do you plan to leverage these funds to secure additional grants, contributions or community support?

We will continue to pursue state legislation and a budget change proposal, as well as apply for additional grants. These funds will also help support volunteer recruitment and retention, as well as ease the cost of administrative expenses necessary to continue pursuing additional funding sources.

9. Will this proposal require new or expanded activity on the part of another entity to be fully functional and effective? If so, name that entity and describe what that participation would look like.

This funding will ensure continued support to CHP, HCSCO, CalTrans, Hoopa Ambulance, and Arcata Ambulance by Willow Creek VFD and Blue Lake VFD.

In Fiscal Year 22/23, which is the last year Willow Creek and Blue Lake Volunteer Fire Departments were compensated for their out of district responses, both departments maintained 24/7 services in the good will response area while ensuring coverage in their own districts. This 120 square mile area includes, but is not limited to, State Route 299, Redwood Valley, 3 Creeks Rd., Bair Rd., Titlow Hill, and many others. Please see the map below. It is to be noted that this map does not show the total area that both departments respond to, and may respond if requested. Also, in the majority of both Blue Lake and Willow Creek's response areas, both departments are paged out and respond.
