MEASURE Z PROPOSAL NARRATIVE Mattole Road Pave

Humboldt County Roads are used by law enforcement, fire protection, and other emergency services to respond to emergency calls. Emergency response times can be hampered due to the condition of these roadways. The County's average Pavement Condition Index (PCI), which is a measurement of pavement grade or condition and ranges from 0 to 100, was 49 in 2022. This puts our roadways in poor condition. If something is not done the roadway conditions will eventually become very poor and even fail. According to the 2019 Humboldt County Community Wildfire Protection Plan, the poor condition of many county roads could present a challenge to safe and successful wildfire evacuations.

The road going through Rockefeller Forest State Park at Bull Creek is closed due to a major slide caused by this winter's storms and the earthquakes. The prognosis for reopening at this time is unknown. The traffic load that would normally use this section of road is now diverted to other roads in the County roads system. The added traffic will negatively impact these already poor roads, for this reason, Public Works is requesting funding for substructure repairs, patch paving and associated repair work. The work will be focused on the Mattole Road from Ferndale to Honeydew. Other sites needing attention will be determined through public input and discussion. The county will provide the Equipment and personnel for the work. This request is for materials only. This will help prevent some of these County Roads from failing and will provide a driving surface that allows the public, law enforcement, fire protection, and emergency services to travel to their destination safely and without obstructions. Currently, potholes or pavement failures have the potential to damage or disable emergency service vehicles and delay timely response. Funds provided by Measure Z will support the completion of more planned work than current budgets will support.
