Dear Dr. Frankovich,

Amidst COVID-19 prevention measures, we wanted to inform you that Vitalant, along with our nation's other blood banks, are urging healthy individuals to donate blood—and organizations to maintain scheduled blood drives—to ensure patients have lifesaving products.

Public health officials are enacting a number of measures to limit COVID-19—and the nation's blood banks support these initiatives. But as people stay homebound and avoid public events, the stability of our national blood supply becomes endangered.

Therefore, Vitalant requests that you and other public health officials, in public communications, support critical health-related activities like blood donations.

"We ask public health officials to join us in reaching out to the public, encouraging people to donate blood. As events are canceled and travel restrictions are imposed, we need to ensure that healthy donors continue to donate blood and organizations continue to host blood drives," said Dr. Ralph Vassallo, Vitalant's chief medical & scientific officer. "Hospitals will be extremely challenged if COVID-19 infections increase. The last thing we want them worrying about is having enough blood for trauma victims and cancer patients."

"Sick hospital patients rely on blood donors—there is no other source for blood," Vassallo said. "We need healthy individuals to donate blood, while following safety recommendations from the CDC and other agencies."

Blood banks have always required individuals to be in good health to donate blood, and the blood collection process follows policies established by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to keep donors and patients safe.

In addition to barring non-healthy individuals from donating, Vitalant is telling individuals not to donate if they have visited CDC travel warning countries, currently Mainland China, South Korea, Iran and Italy within 28 days or have had an infection or been exposed to someone suspected of having a COVID-19 infection.

"The CDC remains on record that currently, the risk of contracting COVID-19 is low," Vassallo said. "Furthermore, due to the nature of the virus, it is highly unlikely that it can be transmitted through blood transfusions."

The blood collection process is safe as well. In addition to the vigorous FDA-mandated testing of all blood components donated, Vitalant staff follow rigorous safety and disinfection protocols within our mobile and fixed donation centers.

Vitalant is actively monitoring the situation and will efficiently implement any necessary changes as new information emerges from the CDC, FDA and AABB. Read Vitalant's response to COVID-19 here.

People who have underlying chronic medical conditions and who live in congregate settings, like nursing homes, are at the highest risk for being affected by COVID-19. The attached guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is specific to nursing homes and skilled nursing facilities. The guidance can also apply to assisted living facilities. Dr. John Sullivan, former Humboldt County Deputy Health Officer, has many concerns regarding the facility he currently works for (Redwood Coast Regional Center) and COVID-19. I feel that his concerns are valid, but probably unavoidable. Mostly he was wondering how we would change our guidance, once COVID-19 were widespread in the community. The Regional Center is staffed by a skeleton crew – having people stay home until all symptoms were gone was a major concern for Dr. Sullivan, as it leaves it up to the employee to determine their level of illness. Dr. Sullivan was concerned that folks could be out for several weeks with nothing more than a cough – and that would leave the participants in the regional center without their caregivers. The regional center sees some medically fragile folks and there is a residential section of the center – so people living in a congregate setting.

Dr. Sullivan wanted me to plant a bug in your ear about this and he was hoping to be able to discuss his concerns more. You are busy, so I won't write all of the concerns out – there are many. He has lots of good points that should be addressed in one way or another. I spoke with him at length, but the answers he is looking for are pretty high level – higher than me, I feel O

Perhaps this is one that Dr. Ennis could take off your plate?

Dear County employees,

We understand that as the novel coronavirus disease (COVID-19) situation continues to evolve, there have been many questions and concerns regarding daily county business.

For your convenience, we have included the most current FAQs and answers below. We will routinely update <u>this page</u> as new questions are added and will distribute them via county email periodically.

1. What precautions are the county taking to protect employees?

Custodial staff have begun increasing the frequency of cleaning county buildings, including cleaning surfaces in public areas as a precaution. Public Health is working with federal, state and local partners to closely monitor COVID-19 in Humboldt County.

2. What can I do to prevent becoming sick with COVID-19?

Public Health suggests the following precautions to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and all infectious diseases, including common illnesses like colds and flu:

- Stay home when you are sick
- If you have a fever, stay home or go home if you are already at work or school, and stay home for at least 24 hours after you no longer have a fever (without the use of fever-reducing medicine)
- Wash your hands frequently and particularly before eating or drinking
- Promote good hand hygiene in your home by educating household members and making sure soap, hand sanitizers, and tissues are available
- Avoid touching your face, particularly your eyes, nose, and mouth

- Encourage proper cough etiquette cough or sneeze into a tissue, sleeve, or arm. Do not use your hands
- Perform routine surface cleaning, particularly for items which are frequently touched such as doorknobs, handles, remotes, keyboards and other commonly shared surfaces
- If you are ill, do not attend or host large gatherings
- Review your family's emergency preparedness plan just as you would for earthquakes or fires or other events that might disrupt normal day-to-day activities. Being prepared will help to decrease the impact of COVID-19 in our community.

3. <u>Are items such as disinfectant wipes, gloves and masks going to be available to County</u> <u>employees, or should departments/employees purchase their own?</u>

At this time, the county does not intend to purchase disinfecting supplies, masks, or gloves for departments. Departments may use their budget to purchase supplies as they see fit.

N95 masks are not recommended outside a healthcare setting. Surgical masks can be worn by sick individuals to reduce the likelihood of spreading germs to others, but employees who are sick should stay at home rather than come to work wearing a mask.

4. What do I do if I am sick and think I have COVID-19?

An employee who is sick or has a sick family member may stay home or go home without risk of disciplinary action. Employees must use their own available leave balances, including sick leave, to cover the period of the absence.

If you or a family member suspects you may be ill with COVID-19, call your medical provider.

5. What do I do if I am sick with COVID-19 but do not have benefit time?

Employees who do not have sufficient leave balances to cover the period of the absence may apply for leave of absence without pay. Employees should reach out to their supervisors and department heads in writing to apply.

If you're unable to work due to having or being exposed to COVID-19 (certified by a medical professional), you can file a Disability Insurance (DI) claim. You may also qualify if you are a

caregiver of someone who has COVID-19.

After being confirmed to have COVID-19 by a medical professional, an employee will need to <u>apply for disability through the state</u> and then would work with HR to integrate disability payments with your paycheck.

6. What do I do if I become ill with COVID-19 while traveling for county business?

If, while on county related-travel, an employee becomes ill due to COVID-19 and must remain at that location beyond planned travel dates, employees will be paid for regular hours instead of using sick leave during the duration. Hotel and meal per diems will also be paid by the county if travel dates are extended due to COVID-19 related illness.

7. How do I file for Workers Compensation if I become ill with COVID-19 while on work travel?

If an employee believes they may be eligible for Workers Compensation due to becoming sick while on work travel, they can call the Company Nurse Line at 1-877-854-6877 to begin their Workers Compensation claim. The identifier code they should provide is "**HUMBT**". Once the claim is started, the employee will be referred to a medical professional for further evaluation and verification.

8. Can I qualify for Disability Insurance if I cannot work due to COVID-19?

If you're unable to work due to having or being exposed to COVID-19 (certified by a medical professional), you can file a Disability Insurance (DI) claim. You can also qualify if you are a caregiver of someone who has COVID-19.

After being confirmed to have COVID-19 by a medical professional, you would need to apply for disability through the state and then would work with HR to integrate disability payments with your paycheck.

9. What actions can departments take if they think an employee may be ill?

Just as with any illness, if an employee expresses that they don't feel well, they should be encouraged (not mandated) to go home (using their own benefit time) to take care of themselves. However, departments may not force an employee to take benefit time just because they believe or suspect the employee has been exposed to the virus. If you have a co-worker you are concerned about, please address those concerns with your supervisor.

If an employee has a fever, they should not return to work for at least 24 hours after the fever has subsided (without the use of fever reducing medication).

If an employee is clinically diagnosed with COVID-19, close contacts or exposures will be notified. The employee will not be personally identified in any communications to employees. Information regarding medical conditions will be kept strictly confidential and employees will not suffer retaliation for reporting that they are ill or need to be absent from work.

10. Is my scheduled travel for county business going to be cancelled due to COVID-19?

Due to the likelihood of an increase in community transmission of COVID-19, county-related travel is discouraged, especially airport travel, and will be approved by each Department Head on a case-by case basis.

11. Who do I contact if I have a medical question or am experiencing COVID-19 related symptoms?

Individuals with fever and cough or shortness of breath should contact their health care provider to discuss their symptoms and any possible exposures such as travel or contact with a confirmed case.

Ill individuals with possible COVID-19 exposure should notify their health care provider's office or Emergency Department BEFORE presenting for care so appropriate safety measures may be taken.

Decisions about testing will be made by the health care provider (in consultation with Humboldt County Public Health if the Public Health Lab is used for testing).

General medical questions relating to COVID-19 should be directed to Public Health at 707-445-6200.

12. What if I have mild cold-like symptoms, do I need to be tested?

Public Health is encouraging mildly ill individuals to stay home until symptoms resolve. If you have more significant symptoms such as fever, cough or shortness of breath and feel you need medical care, please contact your health care provider before coming in for care, particularly if you have had contact with a known case of COVID-19 or have traveled to an area with lots of COVID-19 transmission.

13. Why is the county declaring a Local Health Emergency?

The declaration does not reflect any dramatic change in the health of our community. It is being done to ensure we have the capacity to address the community transmission phase of COVID-19.

It is important to declare a Local Health Emergency because it opens up resources local governments can access to assist with in-the-moment needs, like staffing and equipment resources, as well as recouping associated costs once the emergency is resolved.

Declaring a Local Health Emergency frees up additional resources locally and throughout the state to slow the spread of the virus.

14. What is a Disaster Services Worker and how does that apply to me?

All county employees are designated under California Government Code Section 3100 as Disaster Service Workers (DSW). This means that any time the Board of Supervisors declares a local emergency, employees may be required to return to work or remain at work for a disaster or emergency-related assignment. As Disaster Service Workers, employees may be deployed to different work sites than usual or be asked to perform work duties or tasks that are different from their regular work responsibilities. Employees will not be assigned duties they are not qualified or trained to perform.

Make sure that your department has your current contact information and emergency contact information, particularly your home address and cell phone numbers which will be used to communicate with you in the event of an emergency response.

While the county does not anticipate a DSW call-out for COVID-19, should the need arise to utilize county employers, proper Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) will be provided.

15. Who can I talk to if I need support?

Employees in need of support due to the effects of the COVID-19 outbreak are encouraged to use the county's Employee Assistance Program (EAP) MHN. To contact MHN call: 1-800-242-6220 <u>or visit their website</u> (Company Code: Humboldt). The phone is answered 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.

Since the beginning of this week, CDC has recommended, to test for the presence of SARS-CoV2 (the agent of COVID-19), the collection of both a nasopharyngeal (NP) and oropharyngeal (OP) sample, and combining both specimens in a single vial of viral transport medium for testing. **Going forward, CDC is now recommending collecting only the NP swab.**

This recommendation to drop the requirement for the OP swab is based on an analysis of 1231 pairs of NP and OP swabs tested in CDC's laboratory, which showed that the negative predictive value of an NP swab alone (compared with that of obtaining both swabs and testing separately) was 98.2%. Furthermore, there is indirect evidence that the negative predictive value of testing samples that are likely to have viable virus (i.e., those with Ct values below 33) is even higher (99.0%).

These recommendations only apply when samples are to be tested with the CDC Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) Assay, CDC 2019-Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCoV) Real-Time RT-PCR Diagnostic Panel (CDC), which is currently in use at CDC and in most state and local public health laboratories. When using other laboratories or other assays, please consult recommendations for specimen types and handling that are specific to those assays.

California Public Health Experts: Mass Gatherings Should be Postponed or Canceled Statewide to Slow the Spread of COVID-19

State public health experts announce that gatherings with 250 people or more should be rescheduled or canceled

Smaller gatherings can proceed if organizers implement 6 feet of social distancing

SACRAMENTO – Governor Gavin Newsom announced that California public health officials this evening issued an updated policy on gatherings to protect public health and slow the spread of COVID-19. The state's public health experts have determined that gatherings should be postponed or canceled across the state until at least the end of March. Non-essential gatherings must be limited to no more than 250 people, while smaller events can proceed only if the organizers can implement social distancing of 6 feet per person. Gatherings of individuals who are at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19 should be limited to no more than 10 people, while also following social distancing guidelines.

"Changing our actions for a short period of time will save the life of one or more people you know," said Governor Newsom. "That's the choice before us. Each of us has extraordinary power to slow the spread of this disease. Not holding that concert or community event can have cascading effects — saving dozens of lives and preserving critical health care resources that your family may need a month from now. The people in our lives who are most at risk – seniors and those with underlying health conditions -- are depending on all of us to make the right choice."

The state's updated policy defines a "gathering" as any event or convening that brings together people in a single room or single space at the same time, such as an auditorium, stadium, arena, large conference room, meeting hall, cafeteria, or any other indoor or outdoor space.

This guidance applies to all non-essential professional, social and community gatherings regardless of their sponsor.

Essential gatherings should only be conducted if the essential activity could not be postponed or achieved without gathering, meaning that some other means of communication could not be used to conduct the essential function.

The full policy can be found <u>here</u>.

"These changes will cause real stress — especially for families and businesses least equipped financially to deal with them. The state of California is working closely with businesses who will feel the economic shock of these changes, and we are mobilizing every level of government to help families as they persevere through this global health crisis," added Governor Newsom.

State Efforts to Assist California Workers

California will continue acting swiftly to help workers hurt by COVID-19. Affected workers can visit the Labor & Workforce Development Agency's website to review what benefits are available to them. For instance,

- If you're unable to work because you are caring for an ill or quarantined family member with COVID-19 you may qualify for Paid Family Leave (PFL).
- If you're unable to work due to medical quarantine or illness, you may qualify for Disability Insurance. Those who have lost a job or have had their hours reduced for reasons related to COVID-19 may be able to partially recover their wages by filing an unemployment insurance claim.
- If a worker or a family member is sick or for preventative care when civil authorities recommend quarantine, workers may use accrued paid sick leave in accordance with the law.
- If workers are unable to do their usual job because they were exposed to and contracted COVID-19 during the regular course of their work, they may be eligible for workers' compensation benefits. All information and resources can be found at Labor.Ca.Gov/Coronavirus2019

All Community Guidance Released from CDPH:

The California Department of Public Health has consolidated state guidance on how to prepare and protect Californians from COVID-19 in a <u>single location</u>. This includes guidance for:

- Health care facilities, including long-term care facilities
- Community care facilities, including assisted living facilities and child care
- Schools and institutions of higher education
- First responders, including paramedics and EMTs
- Employers, health care workers and workers in general industry
- Health care plans
- Home cleaning with COVID-19 positive individuals
- Guidance for Using Disinfectants at Schools and Child Cares
- Laboratories
- Health care facilities from Cal/OSHA
- Homelessness Providers

What to Do if You Think You're Sick:

Call ahead: If you are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 and may have had contact with a person with COVID-19, or recently traveled to countries with apparent community spread, call your health care provider or local public health department first before seeking medical care so that appropriate precautions can be taken.

California's Response to COVID-19:

We have been actively and extensively planning with our local public health and health care delivery systems. Here are some of the things we are already doing:

- As in any public health event, the California Department of Public Health's Medical and Health Coordination Center has been activated and is coordinating public health response efforts across the state.
- California continues to prepare and respond in coordination with federal and local partners, hospitals and physicians.
- Governor Newsom declared a State of Emergency to make additional resources available, formalize emergency actions already underway across multiple state agencies and departments, and help the state prepare for broader spread of COVID-19.
- Governor Gavin Newsom requested the Legislature make up to \$20 million available for state government to respond to the spread of COVID-19.
- California activated the State Operations Center to its highest level to coordinate response efforts across the state.

- 24 million more Californians are now eligible for free medically necessary COVID-19 testing.
- California made available some of its emergency planning reserves of 21 million N95 filtering face piece masks for use in certain health care settings to ease shortages of personal protective equipment.
- The Public Health Department is providing information, <u>guidance documents</u>, and technical support to local health departments, health care facilities, providers, schools, universities, colleges, and childcare facilities across California
- The California Employment Development Department (EDD) is encouraging individuals who are unable to work due to exposure to COVID-19 to file a Disability Insurance claim.
- EDD is also encouraging employers who are experiencing a slowdown in their businesses or services as a result of the Coronavirus impact on the economy to apply for an Unemployment Insurance work sharing program.
- California continues to work in partnership with the federal government to aid in the safe return of 962 Californians from the Grand Princess cruise ship. This mission is centered around protecting the health of the passengers, and ensuring that when the passengers disembark, the public health of the United States, the State of California, and partner communities is protected.
- The Public Health Department is coordinating with federal authorities and local health departments that have implemented screening, monitoring and, in some cases quarantine of returning travelers.
- In coordination with the CDC, state and local health departments, we are actively responding to cases of COVID-19.
- The Public Health Department is supporting hospitals and local public health laboratories in the collection of specimens and testing for COVID-19.

The California Department of Public Health's state laboratory in Richmond and 18 other public health department laboratories now have tests for the virus that causes COVID-19. Eighteen of them are currently conducting tests, with the others coming online soon.

Hi Mike,

I just got done with an Access Humboldt Board of Directors meeting. During that meeting, Sean mentioned that he had to reach out to DHHS to try to get information to share to the general public. This led me to question why we had to reach out to them, rather than being on the regular communication list. As I understand it, we are considered an emergency communication channel(s) for OES, but that this pandemic information is not being run through them. **Sean, correct me if I'm wrong.**

This, of course, raised many questions in my mind. The first of which was why when we've declared a health emergency, why OES, which seems to be better equipped for emergency communications, was not putting out information. The second is why DHHS did not reach out to AH, which as you know has an extensive communication network throughout the County through which good information can be disseminated. I also have to point out that I'm a landlord for a County office, and I've not received any official communication regarding steps we should be taking. In fact, there was a large Project Trellis meeting yesterday with over 50 people in attendance in our conference room. We, on our own, have been taking precautions.

I did check out the official County coronavirus page that is linked by a flashing light at the top of your county website: <u>https://humboldtgov.org/AlertCenter.aspx</u>. It's not particularly friendly to use and one has to scroll through links to find information. This information appears, at my quick review, to be English only. The DHHS Facebook page only has a link to the pdf version of the press release. The OES Facebook page has a little more information. The main County FB page has not posted anything since March 5 and it's buried amongst a bunch of other items. Anyway, this is not something that is in my wheelhouse, but I'm hoping that we'll see better communication and coordination between all county departments and that they will use the best methods available to communicate to the public, including Access Humboldt. This does not seem to be the time to continue to allow the departments to operate separately or not actively engage other partners in getting out good information

But most importantly she will not have access to the shared file needed? I think this takes a NARF to complete. (Maybe it is the same as the Meningitis tracker just in a different folder?) I was under the impression that we would be asking nurses currently trained and that have access to this file to step in if additional help is needed. She has cleared her schedule and is available but it might be helpful if we pick someone on the list. I have heard access to the file is important. Amelia did not get her NARF approved until Monday afternoon and she documented in in a word document and then needed to paste over to the shared file.

Speaking of the Shared file. From what I have been hearing only one person can be in the file at a time. This is problematic now that many calls are coming in. So Randy needs to document and then the nurse need to document and they cannot be in at the same time. Is there a way to remedy this? It probably works fine with a low volume of calls but now is problematic.

Hi Everyone,

While COVID-19 response has hit only a few counties to date, I wanted to determine if there are jurisdictions that have begun the internal discussion around modifying EH-specific work/interactions with the goal being **reducing exposure of COVID-19 to staff whose positions require them to interact face-to-face with the public.** Our Health Officer has signaled to the public that there should be considerations around reducing opportunities to transmit the virus, BEYOND cancelling conference travel. This is also being extended internally to County departments. The challenge that many of us face is the "one size fits all" approach to County-issued directives; therefore, messaging from my HO to department heads is to work with our respective professional groups to come up with reasonable and somewhat consistent approaches to our specific work. So, I'm throwing it out there:

- 1. Has anyone started thinking this through for their respective programs? (We have started to think of small ways staff should be modifying workflows, e.g., not collecting electronic or handwritten signatures post inspections)
- 2. Has anyone begun considering the implications of "Social Distancing" requirements, if directed by the HO? (Our EOC is evaluating how much of an impact would be seen and where, if 6' "Social Distancing" is implemented. We have identified some programs that could continue to function with this expectation, some that would need to be modified, and then there's the Food Program, where this would be virtually impossible).
- 3. Has anyone developed internal guidelines or started thinking, yet, around how they want staff to work in a setting where COVID-19 may be present or pose a high risk? (We will be asking staff to avoid inspections of healthcare facilities (including LHCFs, if possible, given their current strain on resources, and potential exchange of the virus... and besides, a number of SNFs here have closed the doors to all visitors).

In an effort to reduce food waste and encourage the consumption of healthy food options served at school cafeterias, Child Nutrition Programs have frequently included the use of Share Tables (also called Share Trays or Share Baskets), allowing for children to place unwanted unopened prepackaged food and beverages or whole fruit from their cafeteria lunches in a designated location for other children to obtain who may wish to consume the items, per California Department of Education Management Bulletin Number CNP-03-2018. Due to the potential for spread of COVID-19 from the handling of these food items between children, it is required that schools immediately temporarily cease the operation of Share Tables until further notice as provided by the XXXXXXX County Health Officer.

The guidance directs providers to fax us a CMR if they are planning to use a commercial lab – May was wondering if that had to be done during the ED Visit (she gave the scenario of a Pt presenting at 2 am) or if she could fax us the CMR the next day (or Monday if it is a weekend). I told her that sounded reasonable – but my email was a little stricter ;)

Now May is requesting I call in and present this guidance. I am deferring this to you, as this is your guidance ③ I will forward you the meeting invite she sent me as well.

If you wish to utilize Public Health COVID-19 testing: This requires contacting Public Health to approve of the testing and obtain a PUI number. Your facility's lab should contact the Public Health Lab when the specimen has been collected. Contact our Communicable Disease (CD) department during business hours at (707) 268-2182 (8 am - 5pm) if you wish to request public health testing. **After hours, you may reach the Health Officer through** Sheriff's Dispatch.

We are continuing to emphasize the need for testing to rule-out common pathogens such as influenza, prior to requesting COVID-19 testing. PH will not be pursuing COVID-19 testing if another likely organism/explanation has been identified.

We require that any clinician who orders the COVID-19 test from a commercial source such as Quest or LabCorp inform the Humboldt County Communicable Diseases Department about the patient so we can have situational awareness using a CMR form faxed to (707) 445-7346. For any questions about this process, please call our CD department at (707) 268-2182 during business hours. Any person tested for COVID-19, whether by a commercial or public health lab, must be on home or hospital isolation until the test results are available. If the test result is positive, the person becomes a COVID-19 CASE and must be immediately reported to the Public Health Officer by phone and maintained in ISOLATION. The close personal contacts of this individual should practice social distancing until the test results are back, and if they develop symptoms, they should also be tested.

Suzy & May,

I wanted to be sure we were on the same page with the provider guidance – and that I hadn't misspoke earlier

- If the ER decides to use Public Health to test for COVID-19, and it happens to be 2 AM, the process is to call the Health Officer thru Sheriff's Dispatch to request testing. Since the ER would be speaking with the Health Officer directly, no forms would be needed to be sent at that time. Otherwise, if the ER decides to use Public Health lab to test for COVID-19, during business hours, they should contact Public Health Lab when the sample has been collected, and also Public Health CD Unit (707-268-2182) to request testing.
- If the ER decides to use a commercial lab (Quest or LabCorp) to test for COVID-19, no matter what time of day, the process is to fax the CD unit a CMR form to the confidential fax line. We don't need a fully completed CMR we just need COVID-19 written in the Disease Being Reported section, Pt Name, DOB, Address, and Date of Specimen Collection. I understand things are rushed in the ER, but this small bit of info will make the whole process much smoother. CMR does not have to be typed, can be handwritten, if done legibly.

I need to find the rest of my isolation handouts – things are crazed at the moment. I will forward you some handouts for folks getting tested as soon as I can O

I would like to ask that you pass this message to Dr. Frankovich whose email address I do not have.

Good Morning Dr. Frankovich,

Having sat in your seat years ago and never in anything close to a crisis like this, first I welcome you and thank you for taking on this work which is going to be nothing like any of us have imagined. You are being asked to go from zero to a hundred extremely fast and my sense is that you have the chops for it. Meningitis and pandemic in month one is unbelievable.

I have developed an enormous respect for this virus and know that we are all in for a really rough ride, and out here particularly away from hospitals and adequate medical care.

I've been in a high state of anxiety knowing that Public Health has a minute of opportunity for prevention and "flattening the epi curve" but have been dismayed in not seeing more direction from the local level. It's awful that you are working under the completely lacking CDC direction that looks more like a disoriented goose chasing after the horse that is long gone into the hills.

We know that countries that did aggressive testing and isolating (Hong Kong, Singapore) have flattened the curve and spared the disaster of hospital overwhelm. In America we can't do the first so we must take social distancing early in the epidemic seriously if we hope to have any chance in this community.

I know you have probably barely met your staff and don't know your resources, but the little word I have from the streets is not great. People call Public Health looking for real information, beyond washing hands like:

"I'm visiting and recovering from something and want to know if it's coronavirus and when I can go back to work (as airline flight attendant), visit grandparents?" Yesterday they were told to go to the ER (no MD here - like a lot of us) and so she did. No test given and now she has no information, a big bill, and possibly exposed people. A quick list of testing criteria and some advice from PH could have saved this entire situation.

Doctors are frustrated and I know that can lead to complacency and throwing up hands which is the wrong thing at this critical moment.

We the public are your patient and we need your direct communication in clear and transparent terms. We don't need to be told things based on lack of information (we are a low risk area - there is no information to support that). We want to help minimize the impact in the community, **pre**vent as much spread as possible, be **pro**active in dealing with it. We need truth. We are adults and care about the community and we know the people who will die.

It is going to blow up here and we are better served if we have at least moved the bomb to a safer location.

I'm wondering if you can assist. We received a rather agitated call from an unnamed ER manager which you can read below.

Now that CDC guidance for testing has been significantly expanded, Public Health has been receiving an increased number of requests from provider offices who have historically been without means for testing within their practice. They typically send orders for labs to outside labs, such as MRCH, for blood draws and CLIA testing such as UAs and rapid influenza testing.

Now that COVID-19 testing is available commercially through:

these providers will also likely route their patients to MRCH for COVID-19 testing as we are seeing.

Dear State and Local Public Health Laboratory Directors,

On March 9, 2020 CDC made revisions to Interim Guidelines for Collecting, Handling, and Testing Clinical Specimens from Persons Under Investigation (PUIs) for Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). The changes include the following changes:

- Recommendation to include combined NP/OP specimens as an option for upper respiratory specimen collection.
 - Nasopharyngeal swab AND oropharyngeal swab (NP/OP swab):

Use only synthetic fiber swabs with plastic shafts. Do not use calcium alginate swabs or swabs with wooden shafts, as they may contain substances that inactivate some viruses and inhibit PCR testing. Place swabs immediately into sterile tubes containing 2-3 ml of viral transport media. **NP and OP specimens may be kept in separate vials or combined into a single vial at the time of collection.**

- Updates to all specimen storage guidelines for consistency with EUA IFU.
 - Store specimens at 2-8°C for up to 72 hours after collection. If a delay in testing or shipping is expected, store specimens at -70°C or below.

Hi All, thanks for those that stepped up to help in this urgent operation to evacuate and place Grand Princess COVID-19 PUI patients. I was happy to assist Aram in this Region II centric mission.

In the spirit of extreme ownership, I want to acknowledge that there was a mix-up in the transports to Santa Clara county and 4 patients were inadvertently taken to Santa Clara Valley Medical Center. They were supposed to be destined for Santa Clara Regional Medical Center and Stanford Hospital. This error was not on purpose and I take responsibility for not catching this error in time to avoid those patients being received by that hospital. In addition, for one reason or another, certain parties in a few of the transports today were not notified in enough time to properly prepare or receive patients. I can assure you that we made every effort to contact the MHOAC's on the Region II contact list IMMEDIATELY to make sure the facilities knew that patients were coming their way based on the Iso Bed polling that we were given. We also made every effort to contact the EMS Duty Officers of the receiving counties in Region II IMMEDIATELY so they could support the hospitals if needed.

Please know that we will make every effort to send the patients to the correct facility and notify the MHOAC as soon as possible for tomorrows op. PLEASE UNDERSTAND, IF YOU GIVE US AVAILABLE BED POLLING NUMBERS, WE ARE PUTTING THOSE ISO BEDS INTO A PICK LIST FOR THE GROUND EMS OPERATORS AND THEY ARE DISTRIBUTING PATIENTS BASED ON OPERATIONAL NEED AND PATIENT RESIDENCE LOCATION. This is the only way to expeditiously move patients off of the dock site and onto definitive care.

Please see the final distribution info below for todays op. Tomorrow we will likely see similar numbers needing to be transported.

COVID-19 in California by the Numbers:

As of March 9, 2020, 7 a.m. Pacific Time, there are a total of 133 positive cases and one death in California: 24 cases are from repatriation flights. The other 109 confirmed cases include 44 that are travel related, 28 due to person-to-person, 19 community acquired and 18 from unknown sources.

Approximately 10,300 people are self-monitoring, across 49 local health jurisdictions, after returning to the U.S. from travel.

Seventeen California public health labs in California are testing for COVID-19. These labs include the California Department of Public Health's Laboratory in Richmond, Alameda, Contra Costa, Humboldt, Los Angeles, Monterey, Napa-Solano-Yolo-Marin (located in Solano) Orange, Sacramento, San Bernardino San Diego, San Francisco, San Luis Obispo, Santa Clara, Sonoma, Tulare and Ventura County public health laboratories. The Richmond Laboratory will provide diagnostic testing within a 48-hour turnaround time. More public health labs will soon be able to test for COVID-19. This means California public health officials will get test results sooner, so that patients will get the best care.

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) issued new social distancing guidance late yesterday, recommending postponement or cancellation of large gatherings across the state through the end of March (guidance attached along with County news release).

According to the CDPH:

- Large gatherings, those that include 250 people or more, should be postponed or canceled.
 - This includes concerts, conferences, and professional, college, and school sporting events.
- Smaller gatherings, those held in venues that do not allow social distancing of six feet or more per person, should be postponed or canceled.
 - This includes gatherings in crowded auditoriums, churches, rooms or other venues.
- Gatherings of individuals who are at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19 should be limited to no more than 10 people.
 - This includes gatherings at retirement facilities, assisted living facilities, developmental homes, and support groups for people with health conditions

A "gathering" is any event or convening that brings together people in a single room or single space at the same time, such as an auditorium, stadium, arena, large conference room, meeting hall, cafeteria, or any other indoor or outdoor space.

This guidance does not currently pertain to businesses, but applies to all non-essential professional, social, and community gatherings regardless of their sponsor. Gatherings that do not meet the aforementioned criteria should only be conducted when they are essential—that is, if the activity is essential and could not be postponed or achieved without gathering, meaning that some other means of communication could not be used to conduct the essential function.

Both SJE/RMH Emergency rooms are encountering the same problem!

People from the community ask for a COVID-19 testing per their employers' request. Their employers ask them to be cleared before their bosses allow them to return to work. These people have very minor symptoms. Some of these people contacted their primary care providers but their PCP asked them to come to our SJE/RMH ED.

The volume of calls is impacting our ED service.

- As of 1pm, RMH ED received 3 calls a COVID-19 testing request
- SJE ED received 10 calls and 3 walk-in cases.

We had this discussion yesterday with Dr. Teresa Frankovich to explain our difficult.

Hey Sean – It was good catching up with you earlier today.

Here's a quick rundown of the relevant coronavirus provisions of the emergency supplemental spending bill (HR 6074). By the way, the Senate cleared the legislation this afternoon, so it's on its way to the president's desk.

The bill provides \$2.2 billion via the CDC to support federal, state, and local public health agencies to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus, of which:

- \$950 million is for "grants to or cooperative agreements with" states, local governments, territories, and tribes to conduct public health activities, including:
 - surveillance for coronavirus;
 - laboratory testing to detect positive cases;
 - contact tracing to identify additional positive cases;
 - infection control at the local level to prevent additional cases;
 - migration in areas with person-to-person transmission to prevent additional cases; and,
 - other public health preparedness and response activities

The bill stipulates that \$475 million (of the aforementioned \$950 M) must be allocated within 30 days. HHS will be putting together guidance in short order and implementing the provisions of the bill.

Furthermore, the supplemental includes language specifying reimbursement for State/local costs incurred for coronavirus preparedness and response activities between January 20 and the date of the bill's enactment. Per our discussion, it sounds as if the County may have incurred some costs, to date.

Precautions the County is Taking

Custodial staff will begin increasing the frequency of cleaning county buildings, including cleaning surfaces in public areas as a precaution. As stated above, Public Health is working with federal, state and local partners to closely monitor COVID-19 in Humboldt County.

Precautions You Can Take

Sick While on Travel for County Business

Hotel and meal per diems will also be paid by the county if travel dates are extended due to COVID-19 related illness.

Precautions the County is Taking

Custodial staff will begin increasing the frequency of cleaning county buildings,

including cleaning surfaces in public areas as a precaution. As stated above, Public Health is working with federal, state and local partners to closely monitor COVID-19 in Humboldt County.

Precautions You Can Take

Public Health suggests the following precautions to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and all infectious diseases, including common illnesses like colds and flu:

- Stay home when you are sick
- If you have a fever , stay home or go home if you are already at work or school, and stay home for at least 24 hours after you no longer have a fever (*without the use of fever-reducing medicine*)
- Wash your hands frequently and particularly before eating or drinking
- Promote good hand hygiene in your home by educating household members and making sure soap, hand sanitizers, and tissues are available

Dear State and Local Public Health Laboratory Directors,

On March 9, 2020 CDC made revisions to Interim Guidelines for Collecting, Handling, and Testing Clinical Specimens from Persons Under Investigation (PUIs) for Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). The changes include the following changes:

- Recommendation to include combined NP/OP specimens as an option for upper respiratory specimen collection.
 - Nasopharyngeal swab AND oropharyngeal swab (NP/OP swab):

Use only synthetic fiber swabs with plastic shafts. Do not use calcium alginate swabs or swabs with wooden shafts, as they may contain substances that inactivate some viruses and inhibit PCR testing. Place swabs immediately into sterile tubes containing 2-3 ml of viral transport media. NP and OP specimens may be kept in separate vials or combined into a single vial at the time of collection.

- Updates to all specimen storage guidelines for consistency with EUA IFU.
 - Store specimens at 2-8°C for up to 72 hours after collection. If a delay in testing or shipping is expected, store specimens at -70°C or below.

COVID-19 in California by the Numbers:

As of March 9, 2020, 7 a.m. Pacific Time, there are a total of 133 positive cases and one death in California: 24 cases are from repatriation flights. The other 109 confirmed cases include 44 that are travel related, 28 due to person-to-person, 19 community acquired and 18 from unknown sources.

Approximately 10,300 people are self-monitoring, across 49 local health jurisdictions, after returning to the U.S. from travel.

Seventeen California public health labs in California are testing for COVID-19. These labs include the California Department of Public Health's Laboratory in Richmond, Alameda, Contra Costa, Humboldt, Los Angeles, Monterey, Napa-Solano-Yolo-Marin (located in Solano) Orange, Sacramento, San Bernardino San Diego, San Francisco, San Luis Obispo, Santa Clara, Sonoma, Tulare and Ventura County public health laboratories. The Richmond Laboratory will provide diagnostic testing within a 48-hour turnaround time. More public health labs will soon be able to test for COVID-19. This means California public health officials will get test results sooner, so that patients will get the best care.

Thanks for taking my call and for your assistance in getting this information to the right person.

Our full letter to Public Health agencies is below. To summarize the main points:

1. The U.S. is on the verge of a serious blood shortage of unprecedented proportions.

2. Seattle blood banks were the first to be impacted, and other blood centers from around the country have been sending them hundreds of units of blood to help. However, as more areas declare states of emergency, this has rapidly evolved into a national problem for the blood supply.

3. While strategies such as social distancing, cancelling events, and closing schools and businesses are appropriate public health measures, the unintended consequence is a dramatic reduction in the number of healthy individuals donating blood.

4. blood drives bring together groups of people, but they are not "mass gatherings". They are controlled events conducted with healthy people using appropriate infection control mechanisms to assure the safety of the products, donors, and staff.

5. We ask for your support to encourage all healthy individuals to donate blood and to ensure efforts to mitigate the spread of disease, such as social distancing, are explicitly not implicating blood donation efforts.

6. Blood donation is safe. Additionally, there is also no evidence that coronavirus is transmitted through blood transfusion.

The Coronavirus-19 (COVID-19) outbreak that is ongoing in the United States (U.S.) and around the world is challenging across many domains, but is particularly demanding on our already strapped Pubic Health system. As the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has coordinated the response to this epidemic, it has used the Pandemic Intervals Framework (PIF)1. Public health officials are expecting regions, and potentially the nation, to see increased disease spread through community contact accompanied by growing public concern fueled by media attention. A key strategy to combat a pandemic is appropriate public health measures such as social distancing, cancelation of public events and gathering, expanded use of teleworking, and closures of schools and child-care facilities. While these strategies are appropriate public health measures, the unintended consequence is a dramatic reduction in the number of healthy individuals donating blood. Maintaining a safe and adequate blood supply during this epidemic is a component of the overall public health objective of limiting mortality and morbidity from COVID-19. Additionally, while efforts to reduce non-essential blood component use, such as limiting elective surgeries, can reduce the strain on the blood supply during a pandemic, the need for blood components remains. Cancer patients, those with blood disorders, trauma victims, and others continue to require blood components. Additionally, as hospitals continue to see more critically ill COVID-19 patients in multiorgan failure and on ventilators, these patients may require transfusions as well. Blood must be regularly collected from donors in the community, it cannot be created in the lab. Blood has a short shelf life, up to 42 days for red blood cells but only five days for platelets. This short dating creates logistical challenges in that the products must be continuously replenished. While blood drives may bring together groups of people, blood collection activities are not "mass

gatherings," rather they are controlled events conducted using appropriate infection control mechanisms intended to assure the safety of the products, donors, and staff. Pursuant to pandemic plans already developed by each individual blood center, further enhanced infection control procedures could be implemented as local health departments deem additional precautions are appropriate.

It is essential that any call for social distancing measures explicitly exclude blood donation activities. As a result of the COVID-19 outbreaks, businesses, schools, and the public have responded with a hodgepodge of efforts to reduce fear and the spread of the disease. Already we have seen businesses implementing or expanding telecommuting and in some cases restricting or closing campuses. High schools and universities, which are currently large sources of donors, are similarly developing virtual alternatives to classes or closing altogether. Churches and other community organizations are also canceling gathering. While these efforts are intended to limit the spread of COVID-19, it has also resulted in the unintended consequence of many canceled blood drives. These donors lost to drive cancelation are exacerbated by the fact that the large proportion of current blood donors are older Americans. Currently, about 60 percent of blood donations are made by people over 40 years old, and of these, 75 percent come from people over the age of 50. This is the same demographic at greatest risk for contracting a severe form of COVID-19, resulting in greater urging to avoid social contact. All of these factors are combining to form the perfect storm with the potential to decimate the blood supply.

The blood community has established mechanisms to ensure a safe and robust blood supply, however, COVID-19 is a unique disaster in its potential for dramatic public health impacts in multiple areas simultaneously. The blood industry is unique. While a competitive market exists, when a disaster strikes the blood community comes together and ensures any impacted area is supported with donations from unaffected areas. COVID-19 has the potential to be the first challenge where these mitigation efforts may not be enough to support a robust blood supply unless efforts are undertaken to ensure healthy eligible individuals are donating blood. The entire blood community is united and undertaking massive efforts to educate the public about the safety and necessity for blood donation, supported by many local health departments actively encouraging donations. However, more is necessary. We ask for your support to encourage all healthy individuals to donate blood and to ensure efforts to mitigate the spread of disease, such as social distancing, are explicitly not implicating blood donation efforts.

The U.S. is on the verge of a serious blood shortage that will lead to blood rationing and triage resulting in canceled elective surgeries and worse, a lack of blood for ongoing support of patients who rely on the generosity of donors every day. HOAC Supports Two New Bills

Last week, HOAC took positions on two new bills. After this week, these bills will appear in the priority list at the end of this e-mail. HOAC now supports

- <u>AB 1965</u> (Aguiar-Curry), a bill to expand Family PACT to include the HPV vaccine within its covered health services. This bill has been referred to the Assembly Health Committee.
- <u>AB 3224</u> (Rodriguez), a CHEAC-sponsored bill and accompanying budget request to provide \$20 million to local health departments for STD navigation services.

COVID-19 Funding Update from NACCHO

Excerpt from NACCHO's News from Washington

[Last] week, after intense efforts by public health advocates, Congress <u>passed</u> the Coronavirus Preparedness and Response Supplemental Appropriations Act (HR 6074), an emergency supplemental funding bill providing \$8.3 billion to address COVID-19, including \$950 million specifically targeted for local and state public health response efforts and a 30 day timeframe to get at least half of those dollars out of the CDC to communities. NACCHO sent out a <u>press release</u> applauding the House for passing this legislation on Wednesday. President Trump signed the bill into law [later in the week].

Through hundreds of Congressional Action Network emails, phone calls, and in person meetings, NACCHO leadership, members, staff, and allies have been working hard to emphasize to policymakers the need for support for the public health response to this virus. A huge thank you to everyone who had a part in this advocacy win and those who are on the front lines responding to this outbreak.

The package includes the following:

- \$950 million for localities and states to carry out surveillance, epidemiology, laboratory capacity, infection control, mitigation, communications, and other preparedness and response activities. Half of the total amount is required to be sent out within 30 days. The bill also reimburses costs incurred since January 20.
- \$826 million for the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases to help develop vaccines, cures and tests.
- \$300 million to help buy vaccines and treatments once they're approved.
- \$136 million to reimburse dollars from Health and Human Services (HHS) programs that were temporarily transferred to support emergency preparedness and response activities at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response (ASPR).

Priority Bill Update

(Changes since last report are in bold)

HOAC Cosponsors

• <u>AB 2077</u> (Ting), a bill to remove the sunset date for California's pharmacy syringe sale program. This bill will be heard in the Assembly Health Committee on March 17.

HOAC Supports

- <u>SB 378</u> (Wiener), a bill to require (among other things) the California Public Utilities Commission to prepare a biennial report on the public health impacts of deenergization events. This bill was passed by the Senate and is now in the Assembly.
- <u>SB 793</u> (Hill), a bill to ban flavored tobacco products statewide. This bill will be heard on April 1 in the Senate Health Committee.
- <u>SB 862</u> (Dodd), a bill to add planned deenergization events as an event qualifying for a state of emergency or a local emergency. This bill was referred to the Senate Energy, Utilities, and Communications Committee
- <u>SCA 1</u> (Allen), a constitutional amendment to remove the requirement that a majority of local voters approve publicly funded affordable housing. This amendment has been passed by the Senate and is now in the Assembly.
